

The way Westway Trust works, its constitution and even its name has evolved over the 44 years since it was created to manage and regenerate the area on behalf of the local community. This timeline sets out some of the milestones and major changes that have taken place.

1930s	First proposals to link Western Avenue with Marylebone Road.
1950s	Plans for the elevated motorway are approved.
1970	The Westway opens.
1971	<p>North Kensington Amenity Trust created.</p> <p>7 trustees are appointed by the Royal Borough of Kensington & Chelsea (RBKC) and 7 are elected by the Member Organisations.</p> <p>RBKC approves the appointment of the Chair of the Trust.</p> <p>The Trust has 6 Member Organisations.</p> <p>The Trust's activities must benefit people living or working in the Royal Borough of Kensington and Chelsea. This is known as 'the area of benefit'.</p>
1972	The Trust has 48 Member Organisations.
1997	The Chief Executive and Finance Director of RBKC cease to become ex-officio (automatic) members of the Trust.
1998	<p>Trustee body incorporated.</p> <p>Area of benefit widened to include adjoining London boroughs for sport.</p>
2002	Name changed to Westway Development Trust.
2008	<p>The legal status of the Trust is changed and it becomes incorporated. The assets and undertakings of the former Trust are transferred to a charitable company limited by guarantee.</p> <p>Constitution allows the appointment of 3 co-opted trustees in addition to the other 15 trustees.</p> <p>20 Member Organisations join the new Trust.</p>
2013	Trust embarks on a major strategic review of community needs, the Trust's activities and the impact and contribution it can make.
2014	<p>Name changed to Westway Trust.</p> <p>Members agree to follow Charity Commission best practice guidance and reduce the size of the board to 12 trustees.</p>

	<p>3 trustees continue to be elected by Member Organisations and 3 are appointed by RBKC.</p> <p>The 6 other trustees, including the Chair, are appointed by the board for their specialist skills.</p> <p>Members, RBKC and the Charity Commission agree to widen the area of benefit to include adjoining London boroughs.</p>
2015	Westway Trust has 48 Member Organisations.
2016	Westway Trust enters into a 10 year partnership with Everyone Active to manage Westway Sports & Fitness and to help achieve the Trust's ambitions for sports and fitness.
2017	Westway Trust has 59 Member Organisations.
