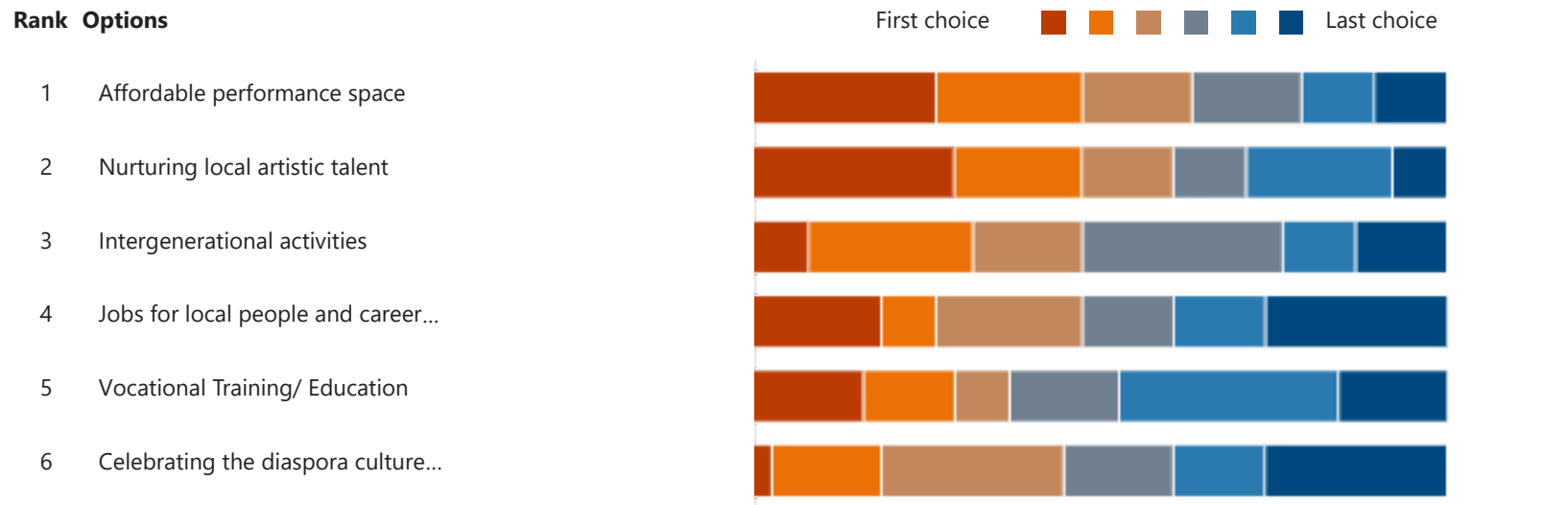


Open Conversations: The Future of 3 Thorpe Close

- Hybrid: Partially dedicated to single cause; partly on the basis of community demand



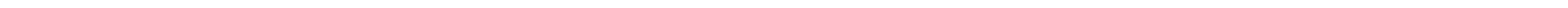
Should the space be dedicated to a single theme, or multiple themes?

Do you think that the space should try to cater to as many people as possible, or focus specifically on the needs of a particular group (age, ethnic, cultural, professional)?

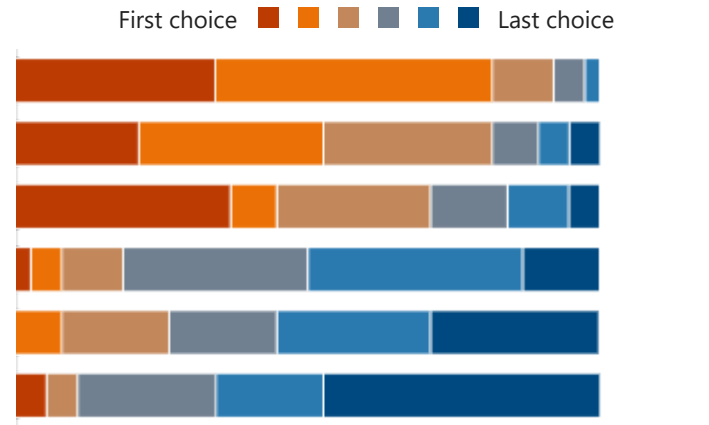
- Catering to the needs of a particular group
- Catering to as many people as possible



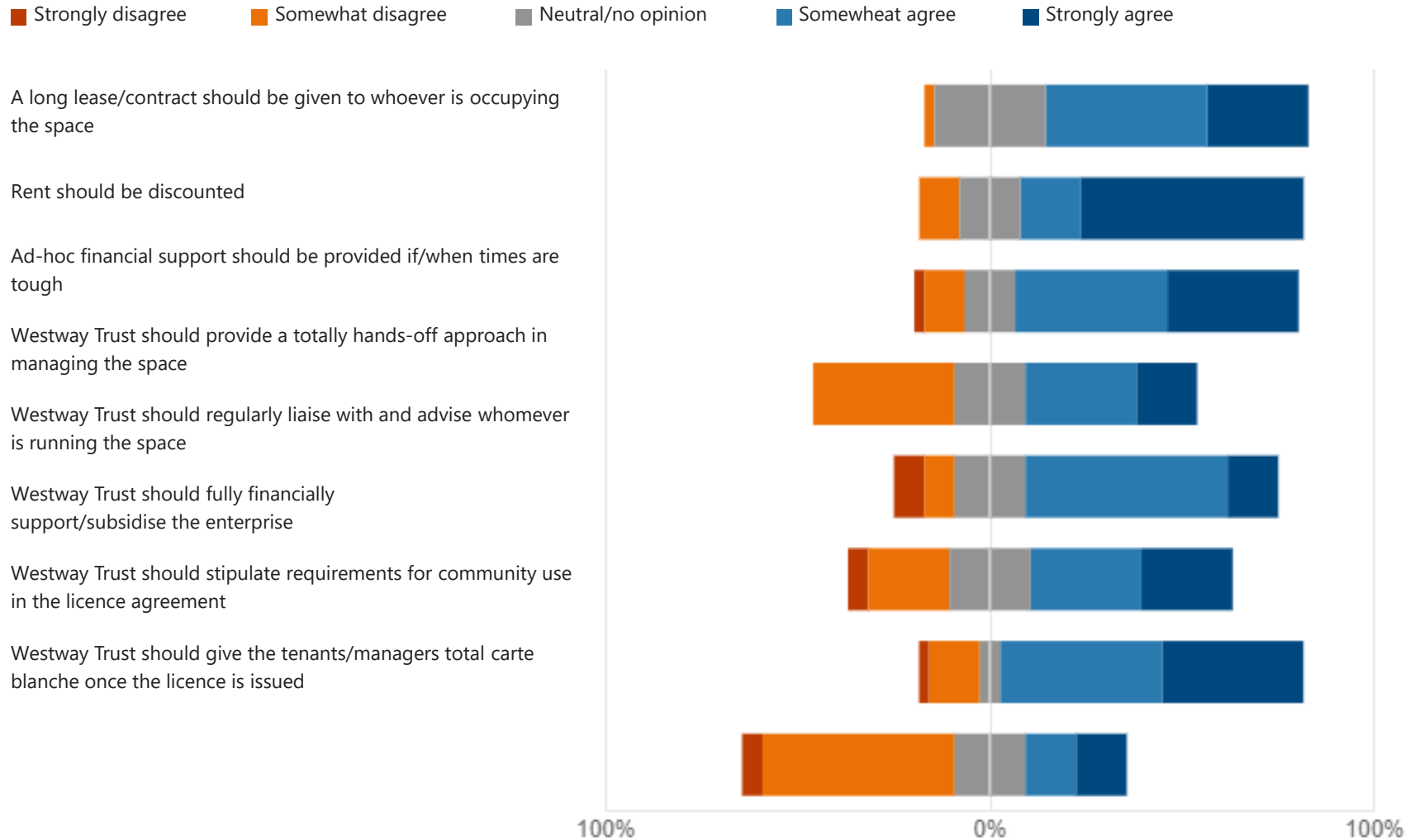

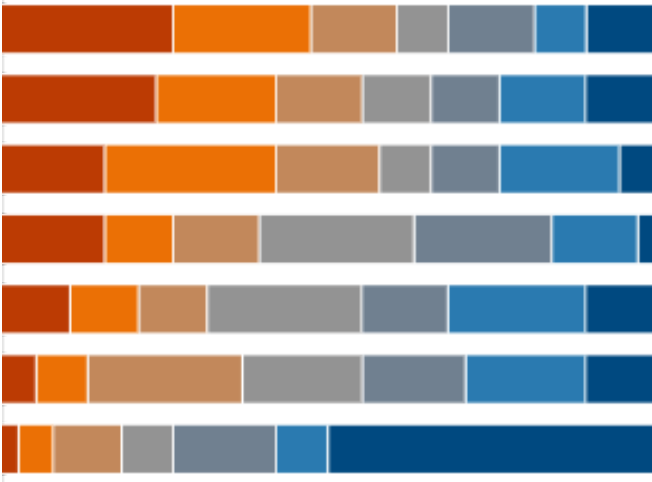
